From the President...

How the world has altered since the Autumn Newsletter was published; our professional, personal and emotional lives have been affected in unimaginable ways as the current pandemic has swept through the nation.

The restrictions of lock down have produced significant changes in every aspect of a taken-for-granted way of life; SAAD has not been immune to these measures which have required some difficult decisions to be made regarding our programme of educational activities. I have been fortunate to be able to call upon the expertise of fellow Trustees during this time of uncertainty, for which I am grateful.

The decision to hold the March National Course at Queen Mary, University of London was taken the Thursday before the event as, further to Government advice, there was no ban on large gatherings at that point. Course attendance was good with many positive expressions for staging the event received in the post-course feedback.

This was the first National Course led by Carole Boyle as Course Director, under such circumstances it was a true baptism of fire. Several modifications were made to the arrangements including the use of larger lecture rooms and the availability of

hand sanitiser. The availability of the online delegate pack was greatly appreciated by participants.

The decision to cancel the June National Course was made soon after the 'lock down' restrictions set out by the Prime Minister on 23 March, were announced.

Arrangements to hold the Symposium in September at the Royal Society of Medicine (RSM) in London were in place for another interesting and varied programme. However, revised guidance announced by the RSM on 30 June relating to social distancing and other critical factors would have had a disproportionate and deleterious impact on the proceedings. Consequently the Trustees regrettably took the decision to postpone the Symposium until September 2021. A great disappointment to us all; thanks to Leah Adams and Zahra Shehabi for putting together such an excellent programme.

SAAD has agreed to extend the period for the SAAD-funded PhD research student to complete the project as, at the moment, it is not possible for clinical cases to be recruited; this agreement with Leeds Dental School will not impact financially on SAAD.

Since the cessation of routine dentistry numerous reports have appeared in national media outlets of patients

resorting to 'do-it-yourself' dentistry because of the difficulties accessing dental emergency services. In the absence of general anaesthetic provision for dental extractions, local anaesthetic (LA) alone or LA in combination with inhalation sedation to reduce anxiety and to manage the unco-operative patient is being used. Anecdotal reports, particularly from referral clinics where child patients are being treated for toothache and related infections, are raising concerns that whilst the immediate problem may be resolved the possibility of creating additional cohorts of dentally anxious and phobic patients in the long term is possible. This observation might prove to be a worthwhile research project and the demand for sedation provision may well increase.

The author of a recent article in the British Dental Journal (Br Dent J 2020; **228**: 675-677), "The courtesy title 'Doctor' 25 years on – the story", is Douglas Pike who is a Life Member of SAAD, a former Trustee, and Honorary Secretary from 1998 to 2004. Douglas led an arduous campaign against the 'seemingly insurmountable barrier' of the Dentists Act 1984 and the General Dental Council that resulted in the removal of the threat of a possible charge of serious professional conduct if a dentist used that title.

SAAD has recently been admitted as an associate member of the Senate of Dental Specialties, an Intercollegiate

Committee governed by the Joint Meeting of the Dental Faculties (JMDF). Our application was supported by both the Senate and JMDF who agreed that SAAD's role is relevant to the multiple specialties. Unfortunately, the Senate meeting, scheduled for 18 March, has been postponed for the time being.

The Trustees meeting scheduled for 1 May was held using the Zoom platform - a first for SAAD. This new way of working enabled compliance with the requirement to 'stay at home' and reflected SAAD's desire to adopt and utilise new technologies, which is an ongoing

discussion and debate amongst the Trustees

The upheaval caused by the pandemic has resulted in additional 'backroom' administration work being carried out uncomplainingly and cheerfully by Trustees and Fiona, Executive Secretary, alike – many thanks to you all for your hard work which is much appreciated.

As the situation evolves the *modus* operandi is to remain balanced, maintain a steady course and to be pragmatic. Please take care and look after yourselves.

Some sad news from Australia

It is with great sadness that we (ASDA) announce the passing of Professor Doug Stewart. Doug died following a massive heart attack on the afternoon of Friday 22nd May 2020 with his daughters by his side and jazz music playing in the background.

Typical Doug... going out in style. He will be missed by friends and colleagues both here and abroad. For almost 40 years Doug was at the forefront of dental sedation education and training through his association with SAAD, ASDA and the University of Sydney. On his return from the UK in 1996, he took up a post at the University of Sydney as Director of the Conscious Sedation and Pain Control program.

Throughout his career Doug's passion was patient safety. His enthusiasm and drive led to increased recognition of conscious sedation as a safe modality of treatment in Australia. Through Doug, dental sedation has led in establishing guidelines and protocols which have been recognised by our health colleagues. Doug was a life member of ASDA, a recipient of the Belisario Award, the highest honour awarded by the society, and served as ASDA Secretary for 16 years.

Internationally, Doug was on IFDAS council for 20 years, including President and chair of the education committee. In retirement, Doug continued to mentor colleagues and provide courses in medical emergencies in the dental surgery.

Most of all, we will miss Doug, a great and loyal friend who could be relied on to put a smile on your face. I and others will cherish those good times together.

Dr Sridharan Suresh: Coroner recommends GMC changes

The suicide of Sridharan Suresh, 50, a consultant anaesthetist at North Tees and Hartlepool Trust has recently been highlighted by the coroner following a series of 'fundamental systemic failings'. Dr Suresh had administered midazolam as part of a dental procedure for a 15 year old girl. Known possible side effects of midazolam include fantasies which may have a sexual element or unpleasant experiences. The girl accused Dr Suresh of touching her sexually and reported him to Cleveland Police.

Dr Suresh was subsequently questioned at Middlesbrough Police Station and strongly denied any such incident. During the three day inquest into Dr Suresh's death it was revealed that there were no witnesses to any such incident and the description of the assailant provided by the patient, did not match that of Dr Suresh 'at all'. The trust's medical director, Dr Dwarakanath, told the coroner that Dr Suresh was 'a highly valued colleague' but had been suspended from work, with the assurance that no GMC referral would be made.

Cleveland Police had unfortunately already made both a GMC and a social services referral. Due to a breakdown in communication however, both the Trust and Police assumed the other had informed Dr Suresh, but instead he had entered into discussions about returning to work. A fortnight later, on 2nd May 2018, Dr Suresh was preparing to leave the house in anticipation of his son arriving home from school, in accordance with the restrictions imposed by social services, when he received an email. This was the first Dr Suresh was aware of the GMC referral. The coroner's inquest heard that the GMC referral had a devastating effect. Shortly after receiving this news he took his life.

The coroner highlighted how gaps in communication left Dr Suresh vulnerable and called into question what risk assessment is carried out by the GMC prior to such communications to doctors. The coroner has written to the GMC to ensure it asks referrers whether the doctor is vulnerable and to confirm employers are informed, so they can similarly be asked. The GMC have since said they have made changes following a review of the case including changing the tone of correspondence, introducing a process to pause investigations, a specialist team to work with doctors with health concerns and training of staff in awareness of suicide prevention.


